survival in that environment are not good. Either take your dog out of the car with you or leave the hound at home. Parking in the shade isn't a good option either, as it's still crazy humid and the sun does move, so its rays may invade your car. We want everyone to survive the heat of summer to enjoy the frozen tundra of winter (no telling what autumn will bring).

- Stylish Pooch! Some dogs find the heavy coats too much to bear, so a trip to the spa for a shampoo, shave, and pedi might be called for. Just don't shave to the skin, because a little hair is natural sunburn protection. And unless you're a descendant of Big Foot, you should take advantage of some over-the-counter sunscreen protection yourself. No skin cancer for pooch or parent!
- Dawn, Dusk, and Shade! Our fur friends still need to exercise, so bring the dogs out in the dawn, dusk, and shade to play when it is a teensy-weensy bit cooler. If you're going to the beach, ensure there is shade for time out and that aforementioned water for hydration. Some dogs like to lie or play in a small pool or dash through a sprinkler. Let us know if you find some fun ways to keep cool in the suffocating humidity of this Florida Michigan summer.
- Tiptoe Through the Tulips! But do so with caution. Summer gardens may include fertilizer and insecticides which can be lethal to the four-footed. Don't mess with a sick pet, get help quick, contact ASPCA's animal poison control immediately—(888) 426-4435. While you're adding that number to your cell phone, ensure that your local vet's number is there as well and also the phone numbers of local vets in any vacation spots you and your dog will visit together.

So, after studying hard to memorize all the pet heat-safety recommendations and passing a 50-question quiz, have a fun, festive, and fabulous summer!


