willing to adopt a companion animal. Taking the circumstances and capability of the potential adopter into account, it is always better to let him/her choose whether to adopt and then to find a pet which suits their lifestyle and budget. You might encourage a loved one to consider adopting a pet and even offer to subsidize the pet's costs but leave the decision to the potential owner. Alternatively, you might think about making a donation to a pet rescue organization in that special person's name.

- Sharing holiday joy with our furry family members also should be approached with the animal's needs in mind. Human food and treats can be unhealthy and even deadly to a precious pooch or cherished cat. Give a small number of treats specifically made for your cat or dog and a pet-safe toy or two. Your attention and love are what they crave, so playing with a new toy together would be the ultimate treat for your four-legged friend.
- One more important consideration is ensuring that holiday decorations are pet friendly. Remember that holiday plants can be poisonous and sparkly decorations which can be broken and/or swallowed could result in tragedy. 
